



I tend to notice U.S. flags that are amiss, like when they are improperly hung vertically as if bowing, or when people mark them up as advertising whether for a cause or for commercial gain. There is nothing wrong with a vertically hung flag, but the field of stars belongs in the upper left corner from the viewer's perspective. I seem to notice when flags are flying at half-staff, as I did the week of February 22. In searching for the reason, I found that it was to honor the more than 500,000 who are known to have died in our country from COVID-19, almost a year to the day when Americans were told, "The Coronavirus is very much under control in the USA." The Importance of Best Practices in the New Cyber Dominated World, Part 2

The first article in this two part series examined how the legal world has changed because of the COVID-19 pandemic. New technology has moved to the forefront of daily legal proceedings, and this change has been rapid and unprecedented. (Admit it, how often had you used Zoom before the pandemic?)

The incredible pace of change in the last year in the world of law has brought with it a need for intensive self-examination in order to determine what the best practices and professional standards are for the legal community moving forward. Part of this self-reflection includes an examination of the cybersecurity and data handling processes currently being utilized by attorneys. IT solutions expert Ed Cordiano recently addressed this topic and recommended focusing on the following three areas:

- 1. Perform a security audit
- 2. Embrace a cybersecurity culture and train your employees
- 3. Use off-site data storage¹

If the topic of cybersecurity seems overwhelming to you, you are not alone. The good news is that resources are available to attorneys and legal professionals hoping to learn more about this increasingly relevant subject area.

The previous article mentioned that informational cybersecurity resources are available through the ABA Legal Technology Resource Center.² In addition, local bar associations often have technology/cyber sections set up to help members navigate through these difficult waters.³

The Stark County Law Library is also here to help attorneys with cybersecurity self-education. Our library offers both electronic and print resource options for those subscribers interested in learning more about how to protect themselves and their firms from cyber attack.

One particularly useful example of an available library resource is the book *Law Firm Cybersecurity* by Daniel Garrie and Bill Spernow. This book provides an overview of

cybersecurity and law firms, details "The Ten Commandments of Cybersecurity," and also provides a detailed explanation of cyber threats. In addition, it also explains cryptography, ISO standards, and how to make your firm "hacker-proof." And, in case you were wondering, *Law Firm Cybersecurity* is available for check out to library subscribers in hard-copy format.

For a slightly different spin on the cybersecurity topic, the library offers subscribers access to the "Cybersecurity & Privacy Law Suite" available through the Wolters Kluwer electronic product CheetahTM.

CheetahTM allows users to research topics such as:

- 1. Authentication and encryption
- 2. Big data
- 3. Computer hacking and network intrusions
- 4. Cyber insurance
- 5. Data breach action plan

It also provides access to *Computer and Internet Lawyer*, *Cybersecurity and Privacy News*, and many more reports and newsletters relating to computer law.





Although the purple line between #8 and #9 is almost all through open woods, there is something else to consider. After we cross the stream, how many contour lines will we climb before we start down again if we follow the purple line? Now, consider bending your line of travel so that it travels through the clearing between #6 and #7. Once you leave the east tip of the clearing, keep moving forward without going either up or down. This will bring you very near the tree at #9. How many contour lines of climb will this save you? Things don't always go as planned, so here's a tip. Let's say that for some reason you pass #9 without noticing it. You will eventually run into the stream. We call this a **catching feature or backstop.**
